Plant Protection Act

current situation in Germany

- Integrated Pest Management is part of Good Plant Protection Practice
- General Principles of Integrated Pest Management have to be taken into account
- Private Initiatives (e.g. Fruits, Vegetables), specific guidelines
- No official numbers available

Plant Protection Act

future situation in Germany (under discussion)

- Integrated Pest Management will remain part of Good Plant Protection Practice
- General Principles of Integrated Pest Management have to be followed, opportunity for responsible authorities to regulate IPM methods for the current situation on the farm (CC-relevance)
- Support for crop- and sector specific guidelines (Number of farms following these guidelines)

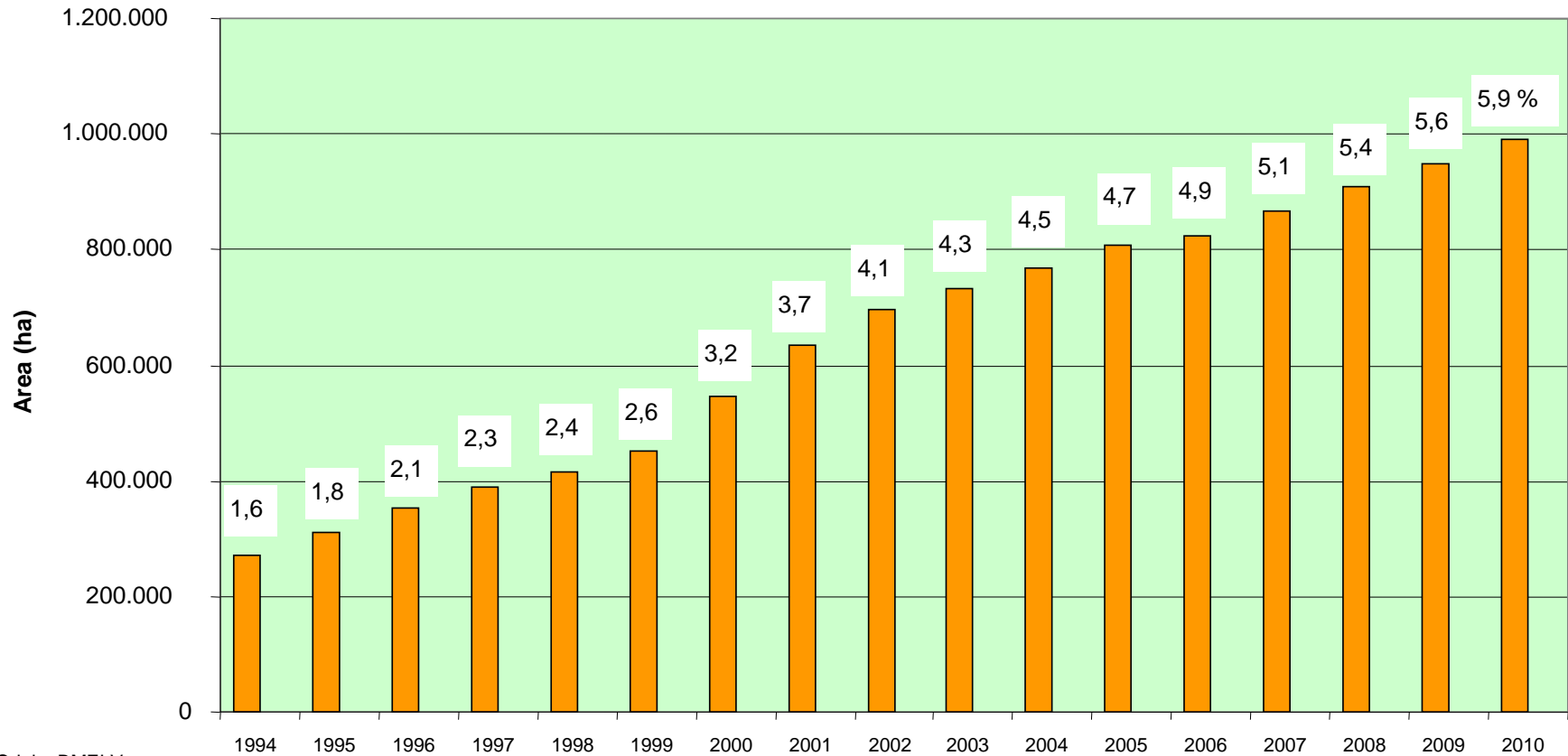

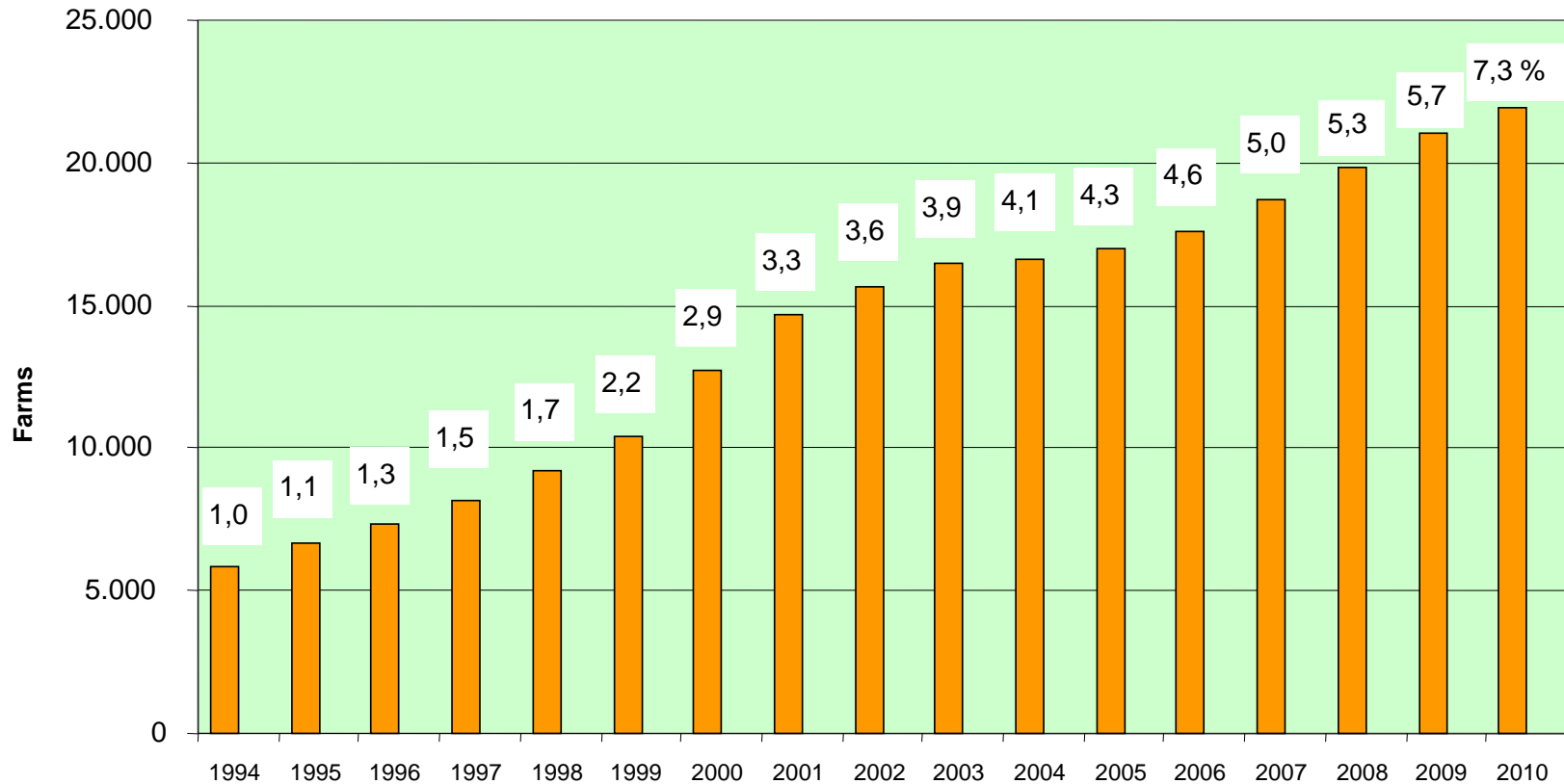
Percentage arable area
