

EU Minor Uses Coordination Facility and EUMUDA



Minor Uses - definition

Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 - Article 3(26):

Use of a plant protection product in a particular Member State on plants or plant products which are:

(a) not widely grown in that Member State,

or

(b) widely grown to meet an exceptional plant protection need



Minor Uses - Importance

Only 3% of the cultivated area, but representing 22% of the value of the entire EU plant production value.

minor use major value

If the EU^{**} fails to provide plant protection solutions for minor use and speciality crops^{***} Is Europe ready to lose a market worth €70 billion/year, representing 22% of the total value of annual EU agricultural output?

- *** Minor uses concern crops grown on relatively small acreage like fruits, herbs, vegetables, cereals including rice, seed crops and small crop seed treatments, hops, flowers and all those plants that need a tailor made plant protection product, whether it is for growing them, storage or transportat



Across the EU these minor crops represent a value of more than 70 billion Euros per year.

Minor Use Problem



Coordination Facility

- Report on the establishment of an independent Coordination Facility on minor uses which is co-funded by the Commission.
- Hosted by EPPO (in Paris) and jointly funded by the EU and by the governments of France, Germany and the Netherlands. Initially for a period of 3 years.
- Coordinator started 1 September 2015. Fully staffed 1 November 2016.
- Coordination Facility will work for <u>all</u> Member States.

Coordination Facility - Mission

The mission of the Facility is 'to enable farmers in the EU to produce high quality crops by filling minor uses gaps through efficient collaboration to improve availability of chemical and non-chemical tools within an integrated pest management (IPM) framework'.



Definition of "non-chemical methods"

Sustainable Use Directive:

'Non-chemical methods' means alternative methods to chemical pesticides for plant protection and pest management, based on agronomic techniques, or physical, mechanical or biological pest control methods.

Minor Uses Table of Needs - GMUS Survey

The MUCF has submitted a priority list on behalf of the EU, further to a survey that took place earlier this year in preparation of the 3rd Global Minor Use Summit that will be held in Montreal on October 1st-4th, 2017. http://gmup.org

This list covers the minor uses needs of the following Member States: Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Lithuania, Netherlands, Portugal, Slovakia, Sweden, United Kingdom and Norway.

Based on the priority ranking as indicated by the individual Member States (priority 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5) the MUCF has added a column that provides the EU-ranking of EU priorities.

The "priority" column, has been prepared according to the following reasoning:

- Priority 1 represents 6 points
- Priority 2 represents 5 points
- Priority 3 represents 4 points
- Priority 4 represents 3 points
- Priority 5 represents 2 points
- And Priority x or no priority represents 1 point

In the "priority" column the highest score represents the highest priority. In addition, the frequency column shows how frequent the needs appears in the respective countries. This will allow you to see which needs are the most urgent and if they occur in many countries. After GMUS, EUMUDA will contain one single table of needs comprising the GMUS list and the C-IPM needs from countries that have not provided GMUS-priorities.

Next Steps for MUCF and EUMUDA

- Encourage all Member States to send their information on a regular basis
 - National Minor Uses list of needs with priorities,
 - National List of references (Minor crops, Minor Uses, useful links, etc.)
- Encourage all Member States to participate in projects, generate and share data
- Next development in Eumuda will be to develop specific work programmes for non-chemical solutions within an integrated pest management (IPM) framework

MUCF long-term funding

- Currently, the funding of the Coordination Facility has been guaranteed by France, Germany and the Netherlands for the first three years.
- Already several other Member States have indicated their willingness to contribute to the funding of the Coordination Facility.
- It is clear that minor uses problems will not all be resolved in three years,
- A mid-/long-term planning (5-10 years) and a strategy how other Member States can contribute, has been prepared.
