BTSF trainings on IPM

Training is planned in two phases

<i>Phase 1:</i>	<i>08/2018 - 08/2020</i>
<i>Phase 2:</i>	<i>08/2020 - 08/2022</i>

<i>In each phase</i>	<i>14 training sessions - (3 full days)</i>
	<i>420 people are trained</i>
	<i>30 participants/training</i>

Structure of trainings

Day 1 - Module 1 - Legal Requirements

Day 2 - Module 2 - General principles of IPM, crop-specific IPM schemes

Day 3 - Module 3 - Farm level IPM evaluation - Check-list approval

Day 4 - farm visit, demonstration of control.

Crops are divided by zone, for the central zone there are FC (field crops), VC (vegetable crops), GH (greenhouses) and FT (fruit trees) schemes.

CAP and CC

Common Agriculture Policy (CAP)

Statutory Management Requirements (SMRs)

Standards for Good Agricultural and Environmental Conditions (GAEC)

= Cross Compliance (CC)

CC has been applied since 2005 and is part of the CAP linked to direct payments, Regulation 1306/2013, Art. 91 (CC principles), Annex II (SMR and GAEC requirements).

A joint EP and Council opinion on CC has been prepared to verify the level of implementation of the WFD (Water Framework Directive) and SUD and their subsequent transposition into CC.

SMR

The SMR is linked to sectoral legislation

SMR 4 mainly concerns food law

(Regulation (EC) No 178/2002, in particular Art. 14 and 15, 17 (1), 18, 19 and 20)

SMR 10 is linked to the plant protection products

(Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009, Art 55, first and second sentences)

SMR 4

The requirements of SMR 4 are based on

- ***Regulation (EC) No 852/2004***, according to which the farmer shall take specific measures for the proper storage, handling of waste and hazardous substances; proper use pesticides, keep records,
- ***Regulation (EC) No 183/2005*** requiring the farmer to take specific measures for the proper storage and handling of waste and hazardous substances, to keep records of pesticides, biocides, GMOs
- ***Regulation (EC) No 396/2005***, according to which the farmer shall use PPPs correctly, in accordance with the label, good plant protection practice and the principles of integrated control.

SMR 10

The requirements of SMR 10 are based on Art. 55 of Regulation (EC) No. 1107/2009 - use of PPPs

- ✓ use of authorized products only*
- ✓ use according to the conditions stated on the label*
- ✓ use according to good plant protection practice (PPP selection, dosing, timing).*

The fact is that the record keeping requirement is checked under SMR 4, but the SMR 10 requirements themselves have to be checked from the kept records.

CAP and CC

future

Under CAP 2020, it is proposed to replace CC with the term "confidentiality" in the context of greening,

It is proposed to include SMR 13 with reference to WFD and SUD, namely Art. 5 (2), Art. 8 (1) to (5), Art. 12, Art. 13 (1) and (3).

The SMR 4 will remain as it is and the current SMR 10 will be renumbered to SMR 12.

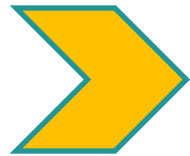

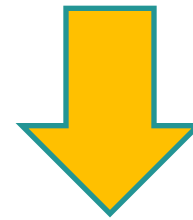

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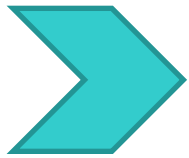
Aerial applications

- *verification of specific conditions*

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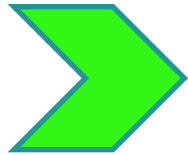


*HRI*s

Problem – non-harmonized approach in collection of data on use of PPPs (PPPs, crops)
- ❑ *12 November – Workshop on HRI-I and HRI – II calculation*
